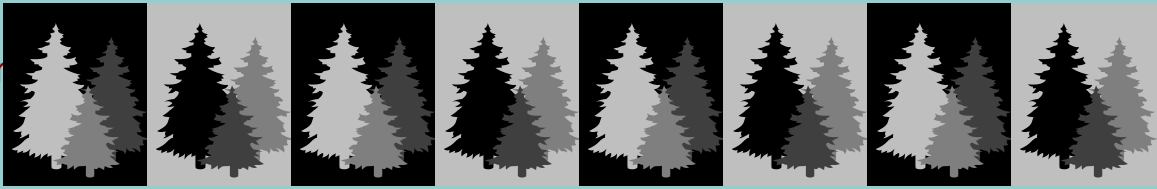


How to get 'em

LOOSE DOGS

a message to pet owners

Yes, there is a leash law in King County, which requires all dogs to be on a leash, even in Mirrormont. We love our dogs, so please protect them and your neighbors.

Dogs are at serious risk of injury and death from cars, garden pesticides, and abuse. Even large breed dogs can be attacked and injured by wildlife. They are also often responsible for property damage in neighbor's yards, as well as intimidation of children, pedestrians, and other dogs.

Please remember to...

- pick up after your dog
- walk him/her on a leash
- keep him/her from running loose in the street

PROTECT YOUR PETS

keep them safe at night

Please keep your cats and other pets indoors at night. Coyotes and cougars live in the forest and will instinctively prey on domesticated animals.

There is nothing going on outside at night that your beloved pets need to be involved in. Please look after them by keeping them safe indoors at night. Also, keep pet food indoors so as not to attract wildlife.

YOUR TREES, OUR FOREST

think before you cut

A gentle reminder that Mirrormont is a living forest. Most people that live in Mirrormont do so because they enjoy what is here. Sometimes it is necessary to take down a tree or two due to landscaping, hazard or disease issues. But, there are strict guidelines with regard to the removal of trees. How you take care of your piece of forest affects the entire forest. Please check with the King County Department of Development and Environmental Services at 206-296-6779 to answer questions and obtain cutting permits before you decide to remove any trees.

BURN BANS

check before you burn

Eastside Fire and Rescue has a total ban on all outdoor burning, except for barbecues and campfires every summer from June 15 until September 30. During the rest of the year, a permit is required for outdoor burning. This permit from EFR is available at the fire station and contains restrictions. (Even EFR permit holders cannot burn during the summer ban.)

Due to air-quality issues, a ban may also be in effect by PSAPC. Wood smoke is a big cause of air pollution, so even during the colder months, if it has been clear and dry, a ban may be on. Please check with the following agencies:
